



ISACo, IACC Announce Affiliation Agreement

The Illinois Association of Court Clerks (IACC) voted to affiliate with the Illinois State Association of Counties during IACC's Fall Conference in Lake County (August 27-30). The conference was attended by ISACo Executive Director Joe McCoy, who made a presentation to the IACC Executive Committee about ISACo and the mutual benefits of working together.
