## **CONTRACTING FOR WASTE MANAGEMENT SERVICES**

**SUPPORT** 

Long-term contracts for garbage collection and disposal enable counties to implement efficient and costeffective waste management strategies. By collaborating with both public and private sectors, counties can enhance waste management systems by promoting economic, environmental and social benefits for their communities.

## **Current Law:**

Under existing law, counties are allowed to manage garbage collection and disposal in unincorporated areas. The Counties Code authorizes counties to contract with corporations for the collection and/or final disposition of garbage with terms not less than one year but not more than 30 years (55 ILCS 5/5-1048). The Counties Code does not have explicit language referencing contracts with waste management and collection companies, leading to a perceived lack of clarity.

## **Proposed Changes:**

This proposed legislation would further clarify existing law to authorize counties to enter long-term contracts with waste management and collection companies for garbage collection and disposal, with terms exceeding one year but not more than 30 years.
